

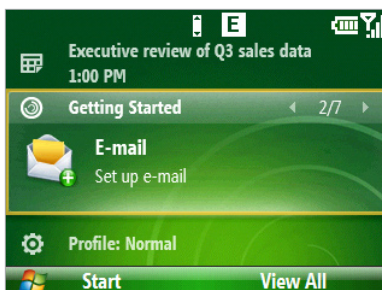
# Windows Mobile Smart Start

## Setting up E-Mail for Windows Mobile 6.1

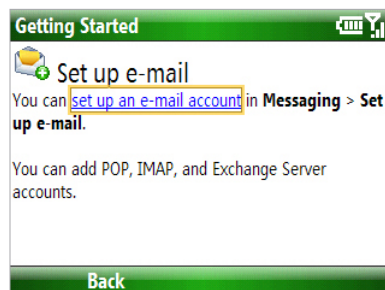
Windows Mobile® lets you set up an e-mail account and start sending and receiving messages in a few easy steps.

### Setting up Gmail, Yahoo!, AOL, and Other POP3 and IMAP4 E-Mail

You can use the new Getting Started Center to quickly set up as many as six different e-mail accounts. You can find the Getting Started Center on the Home screen or the Start menu for Windows Mobile 6.1 Standard non-touch-screen phones or in Programs on Windows Mobile 6.1 Professional touch-screen phones.

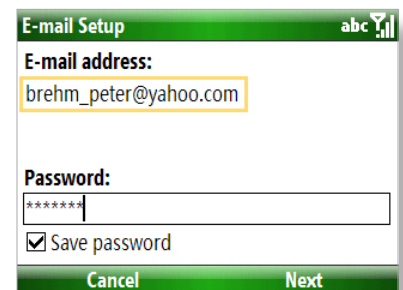


**1** This is what Getting Started looks like on the Sliding Panel Home screen for Windows Mobile 6.1 Standard. To get to it, just scroll down to **Getting Started** and then scroll right and click E-mail.



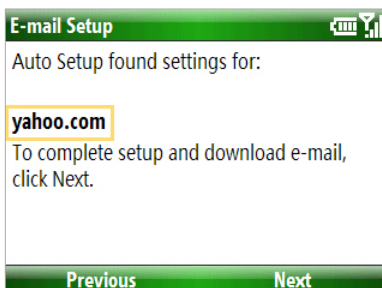
**2** Click the **set up an e-mail account** hyperlink.

**Tip:** You can also set up an account by opening Messaging and then clicking **Set up e-mail**.



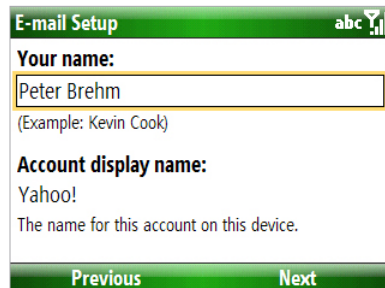
**3** Enter the e-mail address and password for the account.

**Tip:** Select **Save Password** to avoid entering it each time you access the account.



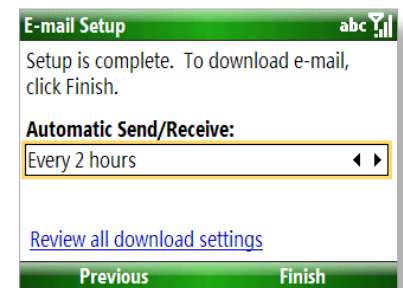
**4** Auto Setup automatically finds the server settings for popular e-mail accounts, such as Yahoo!®, Gmail™, and AOL®.

**Tip:** You may need to enter the server settings manually for work e-mail or less common e-mail accounts.



**5** Enter your name as you would like it to appear on outgoing messages.

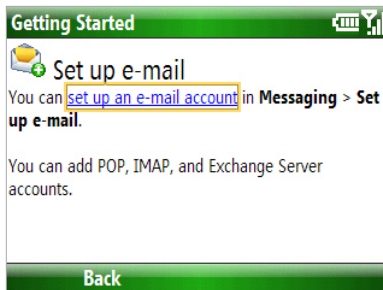
**Tip:** You can also change the account display name on this screen.



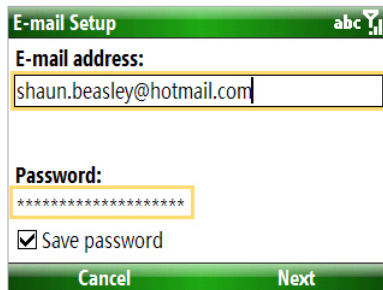
**6** Click **Automatic Send/Receive** to change how often the phone checks for new messages. Click **Review all download settings** to make other changes, such as downloading partial rather than full messages. Click **Finish** to start downloading messages.

## Setting Up Windows Live Hotmail

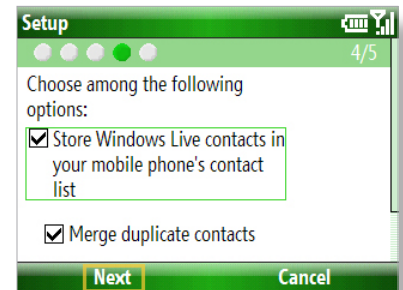
Windows Mobile® 6.1 lets you use the E-Mail Setup Wizard to set up a Windows Live™ Hotmail® account with Direct Push e-mail, or you can do it by simply signing in to Windows Live. What if you don't have Windows Live on your Windows Mobile phone? Go to <http://wl.windowsmobile.com> to download it to your phone for free!



**1** Select **Getting Started** and then **Set up e-mail**. Click the hyperlink to start the setup.



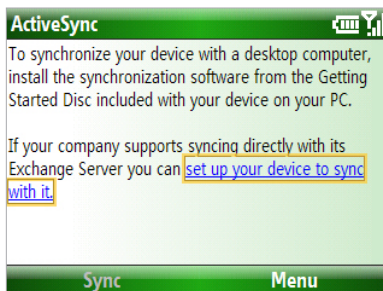
**2** Enter your Windows Live Hotmail e-mail address and password and click **Next** to automatically retrieve the server settings.



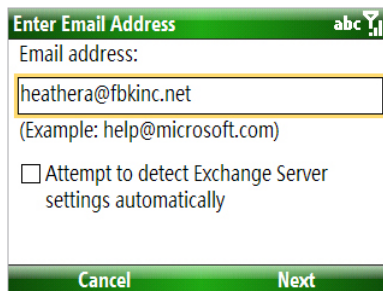
**3** You'll see a few screens with choices on how you want to use Windows Live, such as managing your Windows Live contacts. Click **Next** on this screen to begin downloading messages.

## Setting Up Microsoft Exchange Server E-Mail

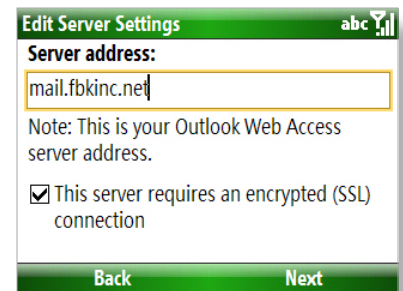
You can get Direct Push e-mail with Exchange. Someone in IT will often set up Exchange e-mail for you on your Windows Mobile phone for work. If you do it yourself you'll need to contact the Exchange administrator for the server information and other settings for the account.



**1** Start by opening **ActiveSync** and clicking the hyperlink.



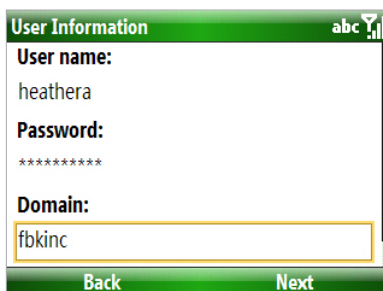
**2** Enter the e-mail address for the Exchange account.



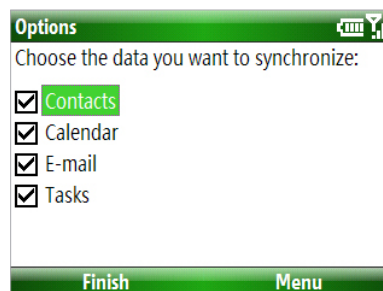
**3** Enter the server address for the account. This is the server address you use for Outlook® Web Access.

**Tip:** You can use either the E-Mail Setup Wizard or ActiveSync to set up Exchange e-mail on a Windows Mobile 6.1 phone.

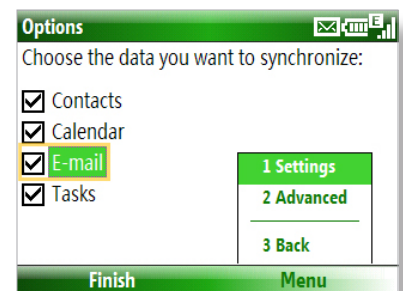
**Tip:** Ask IT if the server requires an encrypted connection.



**4** Your user name will already be entered. Enter the password and domain.



**5** Exchange can wirelessly synchronize Contacts, Calendar, and Tasks, as well as Direct Push e-mail.



**6** Highlight **E-mail** and then click **Menu > Settings** to limit the size of downloads, change the message format, and more.
